Anthem Curbside Recycling Information

Recycling Container Collection Start Date and Container Placement

Recycling Program information such as the recycling container, start date, and other materials pertaining to the program will be delivered between July 5 and August 5, 2005. Please place your recycling container on the sidewalk, with the wheels and handle turned toward the house. The container must be placed out for collection before 6:00 a.m. on your assigned collection day to ensure collection. The container may be placed out for collection the evening before.

Days of Service

You will receive two days of service, but the collection schedule will be split into two types of service. One being a curbside trash collection with your current barrel, one being a curbside recycling collection with your new recycling barrel that will be provided to you within the coming weeks.

Please see the map that specifies which day is what service for your home. The map is located on this brochure, at the websites, and will be published as well in the Anthem newsletter. For example, if you live in Service Area #1 (see map) your service would be on a Monday recycling and Thursday trash.

Recyclables List Materials	Do Recycle	Do Not Recycle
Plastic Bottles or Jugs	Plastic jugs, bottles with screw-top lids or neck smaller than base. Plastics must be PETE #1 or HDPE #2. These symbols are stamped on the bottom of most containers and look like this: 	Plastic bags, cups, food containers, styrofoam, packing peanuts, bubble wrap, plastic sheeting, plastic toys, PVC, garden hoses
Paper Products	Computer and writing paper, junk mail, and brown paper bags	Paper towels, tissues, napkins, diapers, plates, pet food bags, shredded paper, gift wrap
Magazines	Magazines, phonebooks	Hardbound books
Newspaper	Including all inserts	Bags, rubber bands
Cardboard & Chipboard	Corrugated cardboard Boxes, dry food boxes (no liners), shoe boxes	Packing material, towel or tissues rolls, pizza or soap boxes, wax or plastic liners
Aluminum	Beverage cans, clean foil, clean disposable baking pans	Food containers, pie trays, frozen dinner trays, aluminum siding or sheets of aluminum
Steel or Tin Cans	Food cans and tin cans containing food such as tuna, soup, fruit, vegetables, pasta, juice, pet food cans, sauces, empty aerosol cans	Any other metals
Aseptic Boxes	Milk, juice containers, ice cream containers	Foil juice bags

"If it's not on the list, please resist!"



Recycling Container Collection Guidelines DO'S AND DON'TS

Anthem's Residential Curbside Recycling Program will be commingled, instead of source-separated. This means that all of the recyclable materials should be placed in the container together.

DO:

- **DO** rinse plastic containers, steel and tin cans to remove liquid and food, then dry; this will help avoid attracting flies and other pests.
- **DO** leave lids on if they are made of recyclable materials.
- **DO** break down or cut up large cardboard boxes before placing in container. This prevents material from wedging inside the container, restricting contents from being disposed.
- **DO** place any junk mail or loose papers in brown paper bags. This prevents spills. Please NO plastic bags.
- **DO** ensure that recyclables are clean and dry.
- **DO** ensure that the recycling container lid closes before placing out for collection.
- **DO** deliver large pieces of cardboard that do not fit into your recycling container to your nearest drop off recycling bin.
- **DO** ensure that the recycling container lid opens toward the collection vehicle.

DON'T:

- **DON'T** place your recycling container near parked cars, light poles, mailboxes, or near other obstacles that would hinder collection.
- **DON'T** leave your recycling container at the curb after 6:00 p.m. if it has been serviced.
- **DON'T** stack items on or near containers.
- **DON'T** bag or tie your recyclables before placing in them in the container. All recyclables materials should be loose in the container.
- **DON'T** leave inserts in chipboard boxes.
- **DON'T** use your recycling container for garbage.
- **DON'T** swap containers with your neighbor. Your recycling container is assigned to you by serial number.
- **DON'T** place any glass in the container.
- **OPTIONAL** to remove labels from plastic, steel or tin containers.
